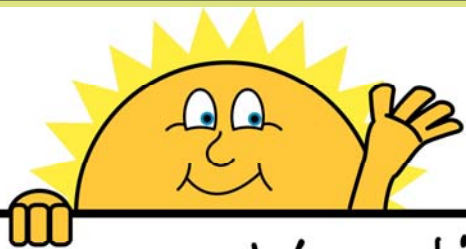

Tips for parents

- Work together to establish guidelines around texting, social media, live streaming, and gaming, such as who your child can do these things with and on what apps. It's important to remember the platforms children intersect with need to be built with them in mind.
