Here are some early quotes from staff after they taught themselves to work online overnight!

Ms Collins Barkey: I wanted to create a listening activity for students at their level, with vocabulary they

could understand. I first wrote a conversation, then asked my own kids to record it with me and splice the video. Unfortunately, when I tried it out by sending it to myself and two friends, it worked on a laptop, but not on a smartphone. After not having success with Googling it (that's how I learned how to insert the audio in the first place), I emailed staff and our Tech Coach for help. Ms. Allum, Tech Coach Extraordinaire, suggested I download Google Slides onto my phone. If all goes well, students should be able to listen to an audio of a conversation, while reading the conversation, and then answer the questions about it! Learning happens everyday.

Ms Barry: I received some pictures to help me see the learning - a concrete graph a gr 1 student did by organizing 10 pairs of shoes and adding labels. Another of a front line worker thank you poster by a gr 2 student.

Mr Cowley: We used a link to Padlet in our digital community circle to start our 'Learning from Home'. There were a lot of responses that talked about students missing school and looking forward to a time when they get to go back.

#### STAFFING FOR NEXT YEAR

Staffing for the 2020-2021 school year is beginning to take shape. In June, teachers, ECEs, special education support teachers and school administrators will be working to develop tentative class lists for next year. When organizing classes for September, staff focus on the best available learning environment for each child, after considering many factors, such as:

- Academic Learning Styles What are the student's particular strengths, needs and learning habits? Does the student work independently or is the student more educator dependent? Does the student work well with activities that are more open-ended? Does the student thrive in amore directed environment? Are the student's work habits well established or are they an area of need?
- **Social/Emotional Needs** What is the make-up of the student's regular peer group? Do they work well together or do they distract each another from their work?
- Class Composition What class composition best balances the number, gender of students, student capabilities, behavioural concerns, learning needs, work habits and social skills?

#### PARENTAL INPUT FOR STUDENT PLACEMENT

Parents wishing to provide input into their child's/children's placement for next year may do so using the following criteria:

- learning needs of the child
- social needs of the child
- special consideration for family/personal circumstances

Requests must be personally addressed to the Principal, Mrs . Young and emailed to cartwrightps@ddsb.ca - no later than May  $31^{st}$ 

As our staffing changes from year to year, our teaching staff assignments will be finalized in September. Teaching assignments and class organization changes can occur in June, Sept and as late as October, due to a number of variables, including: changes in student enrolment, staff retirements and transfers, and classroom grade changes assigned by the board.

At this time, we have established the following tentative class structure for next year:

- 3 FDK classes
- 4 Primary classes
- 5 Junior/Intermediate classes
- 1 Special Education class

Although parental requests are considered, the final placement for each student rests with the staff and administration of the school. Our goal is to provide the optimum placement for each child in order to maximize learning for all. Please understand that much time and effort goes into developing our classes, requests for class changes can not be accommodated in September. Please direct any inquiries to Mrs. Young.
